



## RHYC CAMPING GUIDELINES



- No camping permitted while the club is closed. (During winter, bad weather, or for any other reason.)
- Please camp only in designated areas; camping elsewhere will be permitted only during regattas and other large events at the sole direction of RHYC.
- **ABSOLUTELY NO CAMPFIRES** permitted!
- No RV's, Camping Trailers, or other self-contained units to be allowed on the premises without prior written approval - or during regattas and other large events at the sole direction of RHYC.
- All campers are responsible for cleaning up completely after their stay. No trash and/or waste may be burned. Please deposit trash in the proper large trash receptacles located conveniently on the club grounds.
- Camp stays limited to 3 days **MAXIMUM**. Camping longer than this maximum will be permitted only during Regattas and other large events at the direction of RHYC
- Donations would be gratefully accepted at the Bar for Ground Maintenance.

*PLEASE be mindful that others come to enjoy the beauty of our facilities. Use of these facilities requires guests to maintain a neat, quiet and respectful camp site. RHYC Reserves the right, at its sole discretion, to ask any camper to make changes in their campsite and/or to leave the premises.*



### Dog Policy

It has long been Board policy at RHYC to welcome friendly dogs at the club. By “friendly,” we mean just that. Dogs with aggression issues are NOT welcome. The Kent County Health Department prohibits dogs inside the club, but they are welcome on the grounds outside without leashes. Obviously, dogs must be under the control of their owners. Most of the frequent member-dog visitors have formed their own sort of “play group,” and enjoy romping on the property or in the water. Owners are expected to keep their dogs under control and to clean up after them. The club assumes no responsibility for un-leashed neighborhood dogs who wander onto club grounds. Their owners have been notified.

### ----- Pool Rules -----

All participants and participant families in regattas held at RHYC are permitted to use the pool during the regatta event without paying guest fees.

Non-member children and families attending Sailing School may not use the pool unless accompanied by, and as a guest of, a club member. The only exception to this rule is the every-other-Friday Sailing School "Graduation Ceremony," where students and their families may use the pool as guests for no additional fee.

#### **GENERAL RULES**

- No running, dunking or pushing.
- No diving or flips off the pool sides.
- No rough play.
- No gum in the pool area.
- No balls.
- No swearing.
- No radios may be used without headphones.
- No cutoffs.
- No glass face masks.
- No flotation devices.
- Swimming aids are allowed.
- NO FOOD in the pool enclosure.
- No coolers in the pool enclosure.
- No glass containers of any kind.
- Swimmers must shower before entering pool.
- No smoking in pool enclosure.
- All children in diapers must wear "swim" diapers, or tight-fitting plastic pants covering the diaper.
- Diapers are not to be changed at poolside or on the deck. Changing tables are located in the bath houses.
- Children under the age of 14 must be accompanied by a supervising person 16 years of age or older. There must be at least one adult per 5 children.
- The pool may be closed at any time without warning due to water quality, weather conditions, or at the discretion of the Pool Manager.
- Swim at your own risk. Lifeguard not on duty at all times.
- If you or your child have had diarrhea within the past 72 hours, please do not use our pool facilities. Please think of the health and safety of other persons.
- The RHYC reserves the right to remove any member or guest from the pool at any time.
